

# FAQs FOR TVSD COVID-19 RELATED CLOSURE

**Q: How long will TVSD be closed?**

A: The State has mandated closure from March 16 through March 27. We plan to provide additional communication regarding the closure as necessary.

**Q: How will this closure affect the school calendar?**

A: The Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) has stated that "no school district will be penalized if it fails to meet the 180 day or school hours requirements." Spring break currently scheduled for April 8, 2020, to April 13, 2020 may remain the same or may be used as make up days as defined on the District calendar. We do not foresee a change in the end of the school year for students, though we will not be able to make a final determination until our schools are open and we have clarity from the State.

**Q: Will the 3rd Marking Period still end on March 27 for secondary students?**

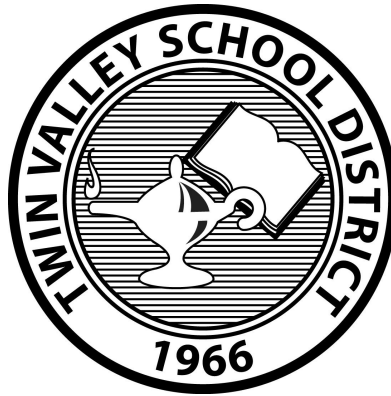
A: No. When schools reopen, we will provide additional information at the end of the 3rd marking period.

**Q: Will there be changes to the PSSA / Keystone testing schedules?**

A: The State has not made a decision with regard to these tests.

**Q: Will there be changes to the AP testing schedule?**

A: We will provide additional information on the testing schedule as it becomes available.



**Q: When will meetings be rescheduled?**

A: All parent/guardian meetings, including IEP, GIEP, Kindergarten Registration, school meetings, will be rescheduled once the District reopens.

**Q: Should students continue schoolwork over the next two weeks?**

A: The District page directs parents and students to optional online engagement and enrichment activities for students.

**Q: Will the work provided count toward my child's grades?**

A: No. All provided optional activities are for engagement and enrichment. These activities are not graded.

**Q: My child was not in school on Friday and did not bring schoolwork home. Can they go into their school to pick up academic work?**

A: No. We are minimizing access to the buildings. Please see the District website for a list of Engagement and Enrichment resources.

**Q: My child has medicine that is at school, what should we do?**

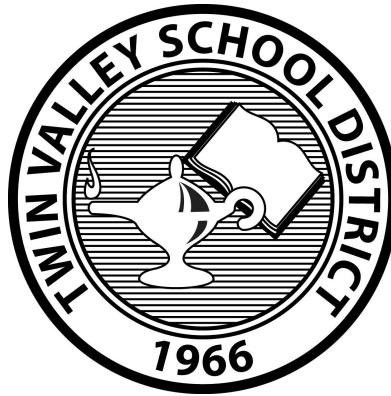
A: Please contact your medical provider and/or insurance carrier for instructions on how to request a refill. If a refill is not available and the medication is needed, please email your building principal.

**Q: How often will parents/guardians be notified of updates?**

A: We will continue communicating with families as additional information becomes available.

**Q: Will this affect Course Selection for 2020-21?**

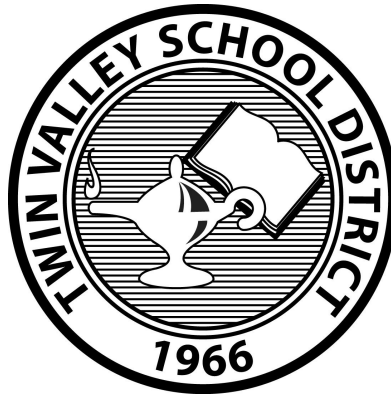
A: Information will be communicated to 8th through 11th-grade families the week of March 16th about the online course selection process. TVMS course selection information has been sent home with students and posted on the middle school [website](#). All of this information will be updated, as needed.

**Q: My student has a 1:1 Chromebook and they damaged it or they need a loaner device; will the district provide a device to borrow?**

While most 5-12 grade students who had a damaged device were already issued a loaner, the district is prepared to provide a loaner device to those who did not receive one previously. **Q: If I don't have the internet at home, how will I access the optional enrichment and engagement activities provided by the school?**

**Q: What is the status of extra-curricular, co-curricular and athletic activities?**

A: To ensure the safety of our students and community, beginning on Saturday, March 14 through April 14 all school field trips, assemblies, and use of our facilities by outside members will be canceled or, if applicable, postponed. In addition, extra-curricular, co-curricular and athletics will be postponed through March 31st. Please note that this is subject to change and we will provide updated information as needed.

**Q: What about the high school prom on May 2 and graduation on June 6?**

A: The status of these events will continue to be evaluated.

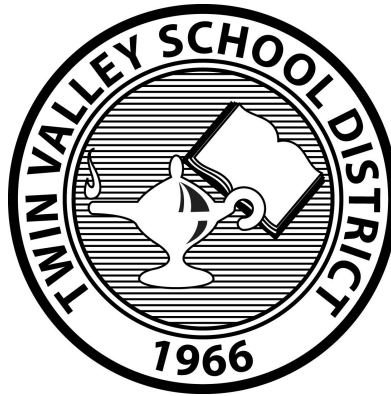
