- Dessert Session: Tuesday, May 9, 2023 from 7:00-8:00 PM in the High School Library





Wrestling ended their season 2-7. They are graduating two seniors. At BCIAA League Championships, Ean Winchester placed 1st at the 285-weight class, Jacob Gryzbeck placed 3rd at the 133-weight class, and Hunter Goff placed 5th at the 127-weight class. Sectionals were held on on 2/18.

Indoor Track - Boys:

- 4x400 placed 1st at the Ursinus Invitational.
- Jaden Brighter placed 3rd in the 800 at the Ursinus Invitational.
- **4x800** placed 1st at Lehigh on December 10th to qualify them for States.
- **Distance Medley Relay** placed 2nd at Lehigh and qualified them for Indoor Districts.
- Anthony Engle beat his own school record on January 8th
- 4x400 got the school record on 1/8/23 and qualified for States.
- Frankie DiSilvestro placed 1st in the mile at Lehigh on 1/13/23.
- On 1/21, **Anthony Engle** qualified for Nationals in the 800 and was #2 in the State!
- The boys took home 21 medals at the Lehigh League Meet on 1/27, which is the most in school history.
- The boys **4x800** shattered the school and meet record at Ocean Breeze with a time of 7:75.23. This placed them 2nd in the State and 5th in the Nation!

Indoor Track - Girls:

- **4x400** placed 1st at Ursinus, which was a Top 15 state time!
- 4x200 placed 2nd at Ocean Breeze
- **4x400** improved their time by four seconds at Ocean Breeze and assured them a State birth.
- Sarah Miller placed 3rd at the Armory Meet in the 800, which was also a school record and placed her 4th in the State in the 800.
- Sarah Miller broke the school 400 record on 1/29. She also qualified for Nationals in the 800 at the meet.
